

1 COURT: If they feel they're being overcome  
2 in that regard just advise them to go out into the  
3 hallway.

4 MS. GARST: And, Judge, I have alerted the  
5 family and spoken with them in detail on certain exhibits  
6 that's going to be very difficult for them to see,  
7 particularly autopsy photos. And we've discussed that  
8 and they're going to be notified by victim witness. I'm  
9 sorry, Judge, if you can't hear me. They'll be notified  
10 by victim witness, Your Honor, when appropriate should  
11 they choose to leave the courtroom. And we're going to  
12 be respectful of their rights and certainly the right of  
13 the defendant to a fair trial in that regard. And we've  
14 all discussed these issues quite a bit, Your Honor.

15 COURT: Very well.

16 MR. ALBERTSON: Judge, could I address two  
17 very brief motions that I didn't feel that needed to be  
18 written down?

19 COURT: Yes.

20 MR. ALBERTSON: This is actually my first  
21 jury trial involving an incarcerated lady. And of course  
22 as I've learned I know very little bit, very little about  
23 women. And one of those issues has to do . . .
